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COURSE CALENDARS

Course calendars are published as separate documents and are not included in the catalog. Calendars are revised and updated periodically. It is recommended to always check the most recent course calendar when registering for a course.

ENDORSEMENT

The Central School of Ministry (CSOM) is a member of “The Association of Assemblies of God District Schools of Ministry” (ADSOM) and has been recognized and approved by the Executive Presbytery of the General Council of the Assemblies of God. Courses required for Assemblies of God credentials which are successfully completed at CSOM satisfy General Council educational requirements for each respective level of credential.

GENERAL INFORMATION

CSOM is a vital part of the mission of the Central District/Distrito Central Council of the Assemblies of God and is committed to the development of healthy leaders, churches, and ministries. Knowledge gleaned from the classroom experience becomes a valuable tool that the Holy Spirit can use to further the purposes of God. Individuals who understand not only “what” to do but “why” to do it are better prepared for their ministries.

CSOM seeks to integrate spiritual information, relationship building and academic achievement to provide a unique learning experience. Students not only acquire knowledge necessary for obtaining ministerial credentials, but also develop the spiritual vitality, character, and skills essential for effective ministry.

Students must be at least 18 years of age and no longer attending High School to register for CSOM classes.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The Central School of Ministry exists to provide training for those sensing a call to ministry. The school seeks to promote a unified purpose for ministry within the Fellowship, providing both doctrinal and practical instruction based upon common core values and shared ministry goals.

The faculty and leadership of CSOM fully subscribe to the statement of Fundamental Truths of the Assemblies of God and commit CSOM to proclaim and support the principles and polity of the Assemblies of God. CSOM commits itself to provide training courses that meet District and General Council educational requirements for ministerial credentials.

Please note that CSOM classes are not exclusively for those pursuing God's call on their lives to serve in a "credential-requiring" clergy type of ministry. CSOM courses are also an excellent resource for "**laypersons**" interested in broadening their understanding of Scripture.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

CSOM is a unique opportunity for both ministerial training and individual growth and is guided by the following principles.

1. CSOM is NOT a college or university. Individuals who can attend college or seminary are strongly encouraged to attend an endorsed A/G college or seminary for the absolute best in ministerial training. See the A/G college guide online: www.colleges.ag.org.
2. CSOM is NOT an accredited school. Students must not expect that their courses will be accepted by any A/G college, or other accredited college. (See number 8 in this list).
3. CSOM is NOT the same as Global University. CSOM satisfies the same credentialing requirements, but Global University students can earn accredited college credit and a diploma.
4. CSOM is not the same as Berean School of the Bible. Although CSOM uses the curriculum from Berean school of the Bible, CSOM courses are only available at specific times. Berean School of the Bible offers student correspondence courses that can be taken any time at a student's own pace.
5. CSOM is NOT the same as credentialing. CSOM certainly helps applicants meet the educational requirements for credentialing. However, credentialing within our Fellowship is an altogether different process with its own exams, paperwork, and interviews. Students interested in seeking credentials should contact the District Secretary-Treasurer. Contact information is on page 3.
6. CSOM students have a structured schedule to keep them moving forward on a regular discipline. CSOM students have constant access to their professors and weekly interaction in a multi-media class session via Zoom meetings.
7. CSOM is about helping those who want to grow in their understanding of the Bible and ministry, but who cannot relocate to another city to pursue a four-year degree. It provides instruction, interaction, accountability, and relationships that are not available through correspondence courses. Faculty members become natural mentors as they build relationships and share experiences with their students.

8. Students who complete all three levels of CSOM's can gain 12 credits at an accredited university through an articulated agreement at SAGU or SEAGU.
9. CSOM IS for those who need to complete their educational requirements for credentialing within the Assemblies of God.
10. CSOM IS for lay persons who may not be interested in credentials or ministerial vocation but who want to learn more about the Bible and improve their ability to serve Christ and their church.
11. CSOM IS for credentialed ministers who want to improve their skills and participate in a continuing education process.

MINISTERIAL INTERNSHIPS

1. Ministerial Internships required for Assemblies of God credentials are available through CSOM.
2. Registration for internships is part of the scheduled courses and will be offered on a rotational basis.
3. Please note that "Master's Commission" or "in house" local church internships need to use CSOM or Global/Berean materials to qualify, since these are the only requirements that meet General Council standards.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

1. Prior to class, each student is required to work through the **Independent-Study Textbook (IST)**. A minimum of ten (10) hours or more of preparatory work is necessary. With the classroom time, students will have invested a minimum of fifteen (15) hours or more per course. Additional pre-session requirements may be added on a class-by-class basis.
2. Recommended Reading Textbooks: The Assemblies of God executive leadership strongly recommends that students acquire and read the recommended textbooks for each ministerial course. Not only will this reading enhance learning in the subject, but these books will also provide valuable resources in later ministry.
3. The classroom instruction provides a summary of the material, practical application and opportunity for questions and discussion. Instructors use personal experience and a variety of teaching methods.

4. Instructors are credentialed ministers (or others with outstanding qualifications) who have distinguished themselves academically in their place of ministry. Faculty members become natural mentors as they build relationships and share experiences with their students.

STUDENT POLICIES

1. **Self-Study:** Students are required to complete a minimum of 2 to 3 hours of preparatory self-study in advance of each class session. For most students it will require many more hours to complete all the assignments. It is highly likely that you will not have enough time to complete your pre-class assignments if you don't get started as soon as you receive your course materials.
2. **Independent-Study Textbook (IST):** Students are required to read the IST and complete the **Self Tests and Unit Evaluations** prior to each class session.
3. **Assignments:** Students are to complete all assignments required for the course prior to the class session and are to submit them to the instructor at the beginning of the class session.
4. **Attendance Via ZOOM:** Students should attend all class sessions via the Zoom App, complete the required assignments, and successfully pass the course exam in order to receive full credit for the course. Missed class sessions may affect the final grade.
5. **The Final Grade is calculated using the following criteria:** (Attendance, participation, and Assignments: 20%; Final Exam: 80%).
6. **Future registration may be denied:** Students who consistently fail to complete assigned course work, are disruptive or uncooperative, or treat faculty or other students disrespectfully may not be permitted to register for future CSOM sessions. CSOM reserves the right to deny registration for any reason that is not in harmony with the school.
7. **Academic Integrity and Plagiarism:** Plagiarism and cheating are serious violations of CSOM ethical standards. Students who breach these standards will be immediately dismissed.
8. **Plagiarism:** A student who submits written material as his/her own work which has been copied in whole or in part from another person's writing without proper acknowledgment is guilty of plagiarism. Material, whether published or unpublished, copied from another writer must be identified using quotation marks and documentation with specific citation of the source. Paraphrased material must likewise be attributed to the original author. Copying another student's paper, with or without his/her permission, or using his/her idea

with only minimal reworking is plagiarism just as is copying material from printed books and magazines without giving credit to the original source.

9. **Cheating:** Any student who engages in one or more of the following behaviors is guilty of cheating:
- Using unauthorized notes or other material when taking an exam.
 - Copying another person's work and submitting it as his/her own.
 - Having another person do his/her work and submitting it as his/her own.
 - When submitting a paper for more than one course without the instructor's consent.
 - Copying answers to exam questions.
 - Obtaining unauthorized copies of exam questions from any source.
 - When aiding another person in obtaining unauthorized copies of exam questions.

10. **Grading:** All CSOM Sessions are graded according to the following scale.

11. **Failure:** A student who achieves less than 70% in any CSOM course will be required to repeat the course or submit additional work. Requests to submit additional work must be approved by the instructor. If additional work is completed, the student's grade for the course will be no higher than C.
12. **Repeat-Course for an Individual Student:** Students are responsible for managing their schedules so that they can attend CSOM courses as scheduled. This is especially important for those students who wish to complete a credentialing level within a reasonable time. However, when emergencies and other unavoidable scheduling conflicts occur, students are encouraged to complete a missed or failed course through Berean School of the Bible or wait until the course is offered again by CSOM.
13. **Visitors:** Only registered students may attend CSOM classes. While family and friends are welcome (from time to time) to accompany students and are permitted to attend the sessions, they are not allowed to verbally participate. Visitors may be asked by the instructor to leave the session at any time and for any reason.
14. **Electronic equipment:** Technology can enhance the learning process. However, it can also interfere with the learning environment. No video or audio recordings are permitted without the instructor's consent. Cell phones must be turned silent during class.

REGISTRATION AND PRE-CLASS PREPARATION

1. Registration: Students are to register by the deadline that is set. Typically, 21 days prior to the course they wish to take. There is a Late Registration Fee of \$25 once the deadline is past. The late registration period is only 7 days immediately following regular registration. Please allow 5 to 10 business days to process your registration and receive your Independent-study textbook.
2. Registration forms are available through the by email requests sent to csom.cddc@gmail.com. Registration forms are available on the District website: <https://cddcag.org/information/central-school-of-ministry/>
3. Complete the form and return it to the CSOM Office no less than 21 days prior to the course session. Include payment for the course fee, **Independent-Study Textbook (IST)** and **Materials Recommended Textbook (MR)**. Upon receipt of the completed course registration and fees, the (IST) textbook and (MR) Textbook) will be mailed to the student.
4. Students may purchase the MR from other sources. It is up to the student to be certain that the specific version of the MR used by CSOM is obtained.
5. A student should begin to read and study the IST and complete “Self-Test Questions” and “Unit Reviews” as soon as received. A basic knowledge of the information covered in the textbook is expected when students arrive for class.
6. A student should be on time for class. Complete all pre-class reading or assignments before each class session.
7. CSOM reserves the right to deny registration to any applicant who fails to follow its student policies or meet its academic, spiritual, or moral qualifications. Registration will be denied to those who fail to meet their financial obligations to CSOM.
8. CSOM welcomes Christian students from other evangelical traditions. However, all course content and examinations are consistent with Assemblies of God doctrine and practice.
9. CSOM reserves the right to deny registration to any person it deems not suited for this course of study. CSOM is not equipped for vision or hearing-impaired students and cannot accommodate special teaching requests.

FINANCIAL POLICIES

1. New students must pay a (one-time) fee of \$30.00 with their "Application for Enrollment". Student enrollment is considered active if a student registers for and attends classes according to the course calendar. If a student stops out for a period of twelve months or more, the student will be considered "in-active". If an in-active student returns he/she must resubmit a new application and pay a \$30.00 fee for re-activation. The fee for Application for Enrollment is non-refundable.
2. Payment in full for registration and textbooks must be received at the time of registration. Please see the book list with the registration form for the cost of books. The tuition rate is \$80.00 per course.
3. There is no refund for students unable to attend a course for which they have registered. Textbooks are non-returnable and non-refundable.
4. Students unable to attend a course for which they have registered may transfer their full registration fee to a future CSOM course. Transfer of course fee does not include textbooks if the textbooks have already been shipped.
5. Checks returned for non-sufficient funds will be charged \$35.00.
6. Transcripts will not be released to any student who has an outstanding balance. A copy of your transcript may be requested by submitting a signed request along with a \$10.00 transcript fee.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Level 1: Certified Minister

BIB114 Christ in the Synoptic Gospels

An introductory study of our Lord's life and times according to the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke. It examines the historical setting, His life between the Annunciation and the Ascension, and His message and method, including His parables and miracles. Organized around three themes— (1) the world, (2) the Man, and (3) the message—this introduction helps to fuse our understanding of His life and work with our commitment to live by the values He taught and demonstrated.

BIB 121 Introduction to Hermeneutics: How to Interpret the Bible

An introductory course on the principles for interpreting Scripture. It summarizes the need for hermeneutical principles and explores the qualifications, tools, and goals of a biblical interpreter. This is followed by a historical survey of hermeneutics from early Jewish interpreters to the present. The course includes a unit on the general and specific principles for interpreting the Bible, a unit on genres, and a unit on applying the principles. Students develop their skills by practicing the principles in exercises that are provided.

BIB 212 New Testament Survey

A survey course giving the student background for understanding, teaching, and applying the principles of the New Testament. Key facts from each book of the New Testament are highlighted in a manner that can be used in preaching and teaching.

BIB 214 Old Testament Survey

A practical approach to the Old Testament that gives students material they can use in teaching and preaching. It covers significant details from every book in the Old Testament in an inspirational yet informative manner.

MIN 171 A Spirit Empowered Church: An Acts 2 Model

A biblical, comprehensive, and strategic plan requires the empowerment of the Spirit to produce spiritual fruit and a flourishing church. The strategic plan is based on Acts 2 and focuses on developing Spirit-empowered disciples who will be involved in the five functions found there: connect, grow, serve, go, and worship. Assessment tools are used to identify areas where changes are needed, and the strategic plan is used to focus on God's vision for each local church.

MIN 181 Relationships and Ethics in Ministry

A biblical approach to the relationships that are important to the minister, both personally and professionally. It looks at temperament theory and its relevance to human relations. This course examines relationships and ethics in view of the minister's personal growth, ministry challenges, people in the community, and other ministers.

MIN 191 Beginning Ministerial Internship

The first of three internships to be developed for the Ministerial Studies Diploma. Each internship requires the student to work with a local pastor to gain hands-on experience in various ministry activities. This course discusses the importance of a good attitude in ministry as well as many functions of ministry such as weddings and funerals. It also emphasizes servant leadership and the minister's devotional life.

THE 114 Introduction to Pentecostal Doctrine

An examination of the four cardinal doctrines of the Assemblies of God: salvation, baptism in the Holy Spirit, healing, and the second coming of Christ. After an introductory unit on the importance of doctrine, there is a unit of study on each of the doctrines. This course is essential to the further understanding of the complete Pentecostal message as presented in other courses.

THE 152 Assemblies of God History, Missions, and Governance

A study of the historical development of the Assemblies of God, the history of the mission's movement in the Assemblies of God, and the ecclesiastical governance of the Fellowship. Attention is given to the General Council Constitution and Bylaws in relation to credentialed ministers, local churches, and district councils.

THE 211 Introduction to Theology: A Pentecostal Perspective

A study of historic Christian doctrines as expressed through Protestant and evangelical traditions. The course provides a complete study of the "Statement of Fundamental Truths" of The General Council of the Assemblies of God.

Level 2: Licensed Minister**BIB115 Acts: The Holy Spirit at Work in Believers**

A thorough study of the content, purposes, principles, and applications of Acts. The course emphasizes the role of the Holy Spirit in the early church and today. Attention is given to the geographical, numerical, cultural, and theological growth of the church from Jerusalem to Rome. The journeys of Paul are examined as the background for his epistles.

BIB117 Prison Epistles: Colossians, Philemon, Ephesians, and Philippians

A practical study of the principles Paul wrote to the churches during his imprisonment. The concepts are presented in language that is easy to understand with explanations, illustrations,

and applications that make the concepts helpful to students in both their personal lives and ministries.

BIB 215 Romans: Justification by Faith

An in-depth study of the book of Romans. It focuses on Paul's systematic explanation of the gospel to the Romans and offers insight into the doctrines of sin, salvation, and sanctification. Students will learn how union with Christ and the indwelling Holy Spirit leads to spiritual growth.

MIN 123 The Local Church in Evangelism

The local church is the provenance of evangelism for reaching its community and the world. After a foundational, biblical theology of the Great Commission and the Holy Spirit's role in evangelism, this course proposes a comprehensive and integrated approach to evangelism in the local church that avoids over compartmentalizing evangelism and discipleship. It focuses on a variety of evangelism methods, the evangelistic purpose of an organized fellowship of churches, and pastoral leadership in evangelism. The largest portion of the course is devoted to the evangelistic responsibility of all believers and practical biblical instruction about effective personal evangelism.

MIN 223 Introduction to Homiletics

A basic study of the principles of Christian preaching. The course emphasizes biblical exposition and deals with practical matters such as the preparation of sermons, the sources of materials, the construction of sermon components, the variety of sermon types, and the delivery of sermons.

MIN 251 Effective Leadership

A biblical approach to the principles of leadership. This course applies those principles in the church setting, giving the student the practical skills needed to serve in a leadership role in the local church.

MIN 261 Introduction to Assemblies of God Missions

An introductory course in the science of missions. It is a survey of the theology, history, and methods of Christian missions in general and within the Assemblies of God in particular. There is a special emphasis on recent developments, crucial issues, current trends, and missions as they are carried out through national and local churches.

MIN 281 Conflict Management for Church Leaders

A biblical approach to conflict resolution. This course offers a scriptural way to deal with the inevitable occasions when conflict arises, particularly in a church setting. It offers practical principles for resolving the conflict in a manner that is pleasing to God.

MIN 291 Intermediate Ministerial Internship

The second of three required internships for the Ministerial Studies Diploma. This course helps the student develop the right attitude for ministry. It examines characteristics to be avoided

and tests to be passed in the life of a minister. It further focuses on public aspects of ministry, such as teaching, preaching, and leading meetings. The personal life of the minister, including time management and personal health, is also discussed.

THE 245 Eschatology: A Study of Things to Come

A biblical study of end-time events written from a Pentecostal perspective. The course studies the Rapture, plus various views of the Tribulation and the Millennium. It provides excellent material for teaching and preaching on the second coming of Christ.

Level 3: Ordained Minister

BIB 313 Corinthian Correspondence

A study of 1 and 2 Corinthians, providing the student with truths for teaching and preaching as well as practical assistance in dealing with the issues facing today's church. The student will learn how Paul instructed the Corinthians to deal with division and difficulty. By applying these same principles, the student will be prepared to deal with the challenges of ministry in the twenty-first century.

BIB 318 Pentateuch

A study of Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy with a practical approach that will provide preaching and teaching material. The Pentateuch forms the foundation upon which the New Testament covenant is based and is an important study for anyone wishing to understand the entire Bible more completely.

BIB 322 Poetic Books

A study of the five books of poetry or wisdom: Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Songs. These books cover issues like suffering, parenting, and the fear of the Lord, teaching us how to live. The course is designed to help the student in his or her own walk with God and in ministering to others who need instruction.

MIN 391 Advanced Ministerial Internship

The third of three required internships for the Ministerial Diploma. Building on the foundation of the previous two internship courses, this course focuses on three attributes of the heart of ministry, characteristics to be avoided, tests that must be passed in the life of the ministry, basic areas of pastoral counseling, and other skills needed to be a successful pastor.

MIN 327 Church Administration, Finance, and Law

An introductory study of many principles, procedures, and techniques used in today's business world as they apply to the local church and its leadership. Attention is given to organizing and

staffing functions of the church, practical methods of raising money for the church's expenses, keeping good records, and managing the church's money, facilities, and equipment. It also gives students a practical understanding of the law in order to recognize and resolve legal questions confronting pastors and churches today.

MIN 325 Preaching in the Contemporary World

The purpose of this course is to help preachers present life-changing messages that connect with the world around them. The course focuses on presenting messages that are true, clear, interesting, and relevant. Students are challenged to present messages that are true to the intent and power of Scripture. The course also examines the postmodern culture and offers help in making messages relevant to the needs and concerns of this audience

MIN 381 Pastoral Ministry

An examination of pastoral ministry in three areas: preparation, responsibilities, and relationships. The unit on preparation focuses on a pastor's qualifications, devotional life, and personal life. A unit on responsibilities analyzes preaching and teaching, worship, pastoral care, leading, training, forming cell groups, and special services. The final unit examines a pastor's relationships with lay leaders, staff, work, and calling. This is a principle-centered study to lay a lifelong foundation for the pastoral ministry.

THE 311 Prayer and Worship

An overview of the biblical teaching on prayer and worship leads to practical considerations for cultivating intimacy with Christ in every aspect of life, from personal, private prayer to corporate celebration. Students will discover the joys and benefits of a dynamic prayer life and gain a fresh appreciation for the many ways in which the Holy Spirit makes prayer and worship both meaningful and powerful. An examination of some of the common challenges of prayer, such as learning to hear God's voice, the problem of unanswered prayer, and what to do when it seems God is not speaking, is followed by practical insight for becoming more effective and fervent prayer warriors.
